AFRICA MINING VISION



- **The African Mining Vision (AMV) is a continental strategy adopted by Heads of States and Governments in 2009 to maximize the contribution of minerals resources exploitation for socio-economic development.**
- **The African Mining Vision serves as a blueprint for a transparent, equitable and optimal exploitation of African Mineral Resources, including liquid, gas and solid resources, to underpin broad-based sustainable growth and socio-economic development**
- **The AMV is being implemented by the AUC for the member states with the following key partners: the UNDP, the UNECA and the African Legal Support Facility (ALSF) of the African Development Bank**
- **The AMV has a footprint in more than 25 member states of the African Union**

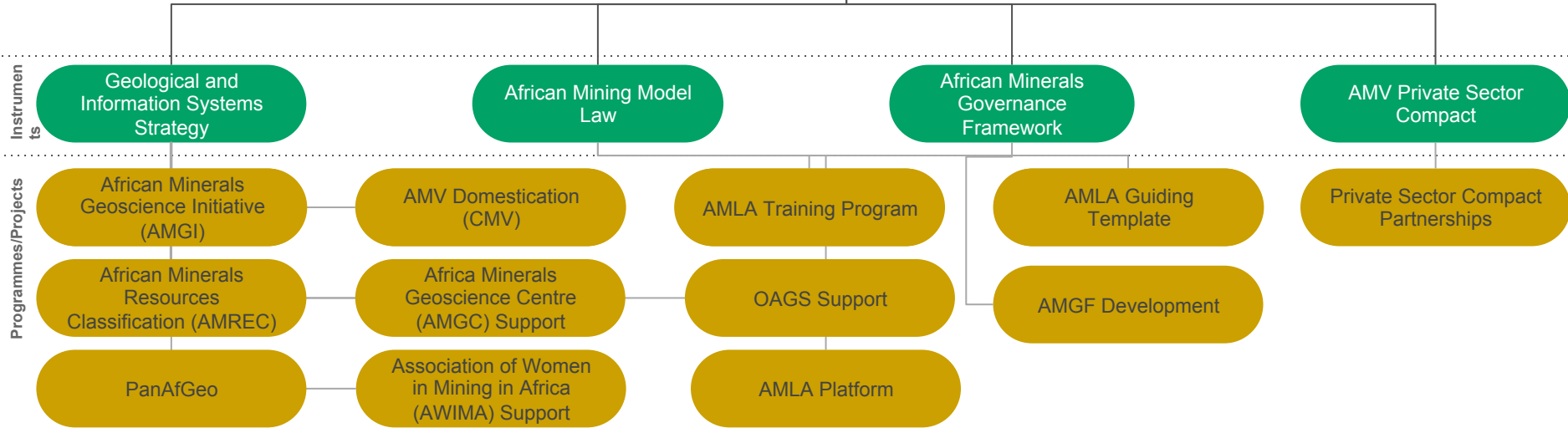
